Postdoctoral Fellowships in Clinical Child Psychology

The New England Center for OCD and Anxiety (NECOA), Boston and Los Angeles

We are delighted to invite applications for our two-year postdoctoral fellowship program designed to facilitate advanced competencies in Clinical Child Psychology and evidence-based treatment for obsessive compulsive and anxiety disorders. Our program offers specialized training in work with children, adolescents, and parents, with emphases on youngsters on the autism spectrum, intensive treatment models, integration of exposure and response prevention and Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Spanish-language services, and clinical research. We are offering 2 positions (one in Boston, one in Los Angeles) for the 2021-2023 training years, which will begin in September 2021. NECOA is a group of specialty clinics that provide evidence-based assessment and treatment for children, adolescents, and adults with obsessive compulsive spectrum and anxiety disorders.

The mission of the NECOA Clinical Child Psychology Fellowship program is to advance the profession of psychology and reduce mental health disparities through exceptional clinical training, dissemination of evidence-based treatment, and clinical research. We hope to provide foundational support for our trainees such that they are well-prepared to engage in clinical practice, research, and teaching. Training is based at NECOA clinics in Boston and Los Angeles.

Throughout the year, fellows will spend time in activities related to clinical service in our outpatient, intensive outpatient, and parenting programs, conducting clinical research, and participating in didactics/professional development. Fellows will spend 80% time in clinical care, which involves assessment and treatment for individuals and groups, clinic supervision of practicum students, and clinical consultation and teaching. Twenty percent (20%) time will be spent in clinical research, program development and evaluation, and teaching. Our program strives to develop early career psychologists who are skilled clinicians, strong clinical researchers, and good citizens well-suited for careers in clinical practice, research, and leadership in clinical or academic settings. Applicants should have training from APA- or CPA-accredited doctoral and internship programs, although we will consider well-qualified individuals from non-accredited programs also. Applicants of color, members of the LGBTQIA+ community, and/or with expertise in Spanish are especially encouraged to apply. Our program application deadline is **January 1, 2021**. **Please send:**
